# Cherokee Chapter Honorary Member Jon Neuman



If you look at the back of any copy of The Antique Motorcycle, the official publication of the AMCA, you will find a section dedicated to Honorary Members. Honorary membership in the AMCA is intended to provide recognition to persons who have made extraordinary and enduring contributions to motorcycling. Contributions may be within (but not limited to) the fields of racing, authorship, research, preservation, promotion, restoration, motorcycle-related business, AMCA National and Chapter leadership, and lifetime achievement within the motorcycle industry. The nominees should be persons of

good character and recognized by peers as leaders within their field of endeavor. In 2022, Cherokee Chapter AMCA started our own Hall of Fame dedicated to honor Cherokee Members who have made significant contributions to Cherokee Chapter AMCA and to promoting and restoring antique motorcycles.

The nominees should be persons of good character and recognized by peers as leaders within their field of endeavor. A Nominee's conduct and behavior within the Cherokee Chapter AMCA and the community shall be considered. The nomination must be submitted by an active Cherokee Chapter AMCA member in good standing and be attested to by two additional Cherokee Chapter members. The nominee is required to be an active Cherokee Chapter AMCA member. Nominated members are then elected to the status of Honorary Cherokee Chapter AMCA member by the Cherokee Board of Directors.

In 2022, Jon Neuman was nominated by multiple Cherokee members to be a candidate for the Cherokee Chapter Hall of Fame and was unanimously voted in as by the Cherokee Chapter Board of Directors as an Honorary Cherokee Chapter Member. Jon was nominated based on his contributions during Cherokee Chapter National Road Runs, which in 2019 set the record for the AMCA's largest attended road run. Jon's efforts in research, preservation, promotion, restoration within his antique motorcycle-related business, Sagebrush Cycles, where he has helped hundreds of other antique motorcycle enthusiasts get their bikes restored for collections or race ready for national events such as AMCA National Road Runs, the Antique Motorcycle Cannonball and The Chase. Jon has not only restored motorcycles for these events, he has raced in them numerous times bringing attention not only to the antique motorcycle community but also to Cherokee Chapter AMCA.

The drawing for 'Kickstart My Heart' was held and congratulations to Niccole Deister for being the winner! Thanks to everyone that supported this great program.


Victor introduced the new posters for Fandango, they look great.


