Winter 2018




Run to the Rio Grande

Pate 2018

After three successful years at Pate, 2018 will be the last year at this event for the AMCA Cherokee Chapter. This allows us to prepare and promote our new and larger event in Fredericksburg, Texas at the Gillespie County Fairgrounds on April 5-7, 2019. The decision to scale down Pate and to go forward with Fredericksburg was made by the Cherokee Board of Directors at our December 2017 meeting.

Fredericksburg will be a 3-day Cherokee-controlled event in a place that is rider friendly, with a covered Bike Show and vendor spaces, and vintage racing on the ½ mile dirt track. Finally and most importantly, how are we going to handle Pate in 2018? The Cherokee Chapter will not participate in Pate 2018 as a main event or have a Bike Show in 2018. 

Preregistration prior to January 31, 2018 will be handled by the Cherokee Chapter and we will guarantee vendors spaces from the previous year. Preregistration after 1/31/2018 will be through Pate and Cherokee will not accept any more payments after that date in an effort to reconcile all Pate administrative matters and focus on upcoming events. If you have already preregistered, your spots are guaranteed. But, because of Cherokee's smaller presence at in Pate 2018, we will refund any preregistered vendor who does not want to participate. I apologize for the inconvenience to all members and vendors by the Board's decision, but I ask you to look to the future and to Fredricksburg 2019.





Last October I took my 48 panhead for a ride around the neighborhood when I got home after work. I wanted to make sure everything was road ready because I was going to ride it to Tupps' Brewery for the Ratrodtober show. Well I got a few blocks from the house and I heard a funny noise coming out of the primary. Before I could get home the bike just stopped in it's tracks. Engine was running but no power was being transferred to the rear wheel. After my ever gracious wife came with the truck and we hauled the bike back home. I took it apart and found that the clutch hub nut had backed off. I could have put it back together but I had the 35 with the sidecar there and ready to go. Next morning I met Ross McCoy at Ginger Brown's and we headed up to meet Jon Nueman at his house. About a half mile from Jon's the sidecar just died. After pushing it to the side of the road and some diagnosis it was a dead battery. As Ross told me "horn won't blow, bike won't go." Jon came by with a new battery and we rigged it up and got it running again, but on the way to his house it wouldn't develop any power. I thought my only option was to haul my 35 back to my house but Jon was gracious enough to offer a 65 BMW to ride over to Tupps. The ride over was fine and the day at Tupps was excellent. I got the sidecar back home fine the next day and fixed both problems. What really impressed me that day was the Cherokee members. Ross McCoy helping with troubleshooting and just being supportive. Jon bringing the battery and loaning me the BMW. Everyone pitching in and helping hook the battery up on the side of the road, giving years of experience advice. This doesn't happen in every club, that's why Cherokee is the club it is. Get out and go to a club event, volunteer and meet new people. What you give will come back ten fold. As for me I have to renew my Cherokee membership for 2018, wouldn't want to miss out on this year. Remember to ride safe!
