An overview of 2015 Events was given by Shelby Withrow including the Pate Swap Meet. Pate President and Secretary were in attendance to meet our members. The Meeting adjourned for Coffee & Dessert by approx. 75 members



Pate Swap Meet Announces A New Alliance with The Cherokee Chapter in 2015!

The Pate Swap Meet is now the largest transportation related swap meet in America with over 10,000 vendor booth spaces showcasing absolutely Everything Transportation Related. Located at Texas Motor Speedway outside Fort Worth TX Pate offers any transporation enthusiast everything from turn of the century car parts through far more modern performance offerings.. Over 100,000+ attendees will walk over 15+ miles of streets lined with all things transportation, petroliania, signage, memorabilia, parts covering all periods of auto manufacture and all facets of the automotiove and motorcycle sports industry plus a Car Corral & Concours Bike Show

In 2014 the Cherokee Chapter Board and The Pate Swap Meet Board Officers worked together on a strategic effort "to enhance the Pate Swap Meet", now in it's 42nd year. by making a concerted effort to Showcase Vintage Motorcyles, parts, memorabilia, literature, art, clothing and our Entire Vintage Sport in general. Our Chapter had been looking for an opportunity to enlarge our former Smithville TX Bike Show and Swap Meet with a better location near an interstate highway system that allowed our Chapter to attract more vendors and more Classic Motorcycles to our Annual Bike Show. We contacted The Pate Swap Meet Organization and found out that Pate also wanted a successful motorcycle club to do what we wanted to accomplish. The synergistic relationship has been in high gear since!

The Cherokee Chapter started out pre-leasing about 200 vendor booth spaces and within 60 days we had those spaces almost leased out to high quality vintage motorycle related vendors. We now have a total of **389 booth spaces** arranged for and our leasing activity continues very strong and we expect to sell out these spaces well in advance of the show which runs from **April 30 – May 3 2015**.

Pate / Cherokee Vintage Motorycle Swap Meet continued...



The National Motorycle Museum, Anamosa IA, owned by John and Jill Parham, long time AMCA supporters and Vintage Motorcycle enthusiasts were among the first to lease prominent space for our event. Mark Mederski, who handles events and marketing for The National Motorycle Museum stated that "Pate has a remarkable history of providing transportation enthusiasts with an incredible collection of everything that enthusiasts are seeking all in one great location, and one great facility. The National Motorycle Museum will bring their traveling road show trailer and merchadise booth spaces to Pate this year as a result." The National Motorcycle Museum is also a sponsor of our motorcycle portion of the Pate Swap Meet this first year and we sincerely thank John, Jill and Mark for their vision as a preeminent Museum fpor the sport in supporting our effort.

Wheels Through Time Museum, Maggie Valley NC, owned by Dale Walksler also contacted us for prominent booth spaces. Dale Walksler has been a major vintage motorycle collector with over 400+ rare machines on display in his museum, but Dale also is a "car guy" as well. Dale has owned a wide variety of American motorcars representing marques such as Dusenburg, Packard through 50's cars such as Corvettes over the years. We are certainly proud that Dale has offered to bring his WTT Road Show and also is being a sponsor of our motorcycle portion of the event.

What's In the Barn? ...or perhaps more aptly...What's In The Swap Meet? The Last episode of What's In The Barn 2015 is planned to be filmed at The Pate Cherokee Vintage Motorycle Swap Meet and Concours d'Pate Bike Show at this event! As normal the film crew will do its best to keep up with Dale and Matt as they travel the over 15+ miles of vendor lined streets at this monumental event in search of the rarest of parts, the oddest of oddities and the coolest of cool! Dont' Miss stopping by the Wheels Through Time Display to find out what will happen at Pate, get a T-shirt or have Dale or Matt autograph something for you.

Cherokee Concours d'Pate Be the first to enter your vintage machine(s) in "The Inaugural Year of The Cherokee Concours d'Pate Bike Show! In our first year the format will be People's Choice only. Why.... To kick off our first year swap meet at Pate with over 350+vending spaces is a huge accomplishment in itself. To plan and execute an entire Concours Bike Show is totally another matter with only 4 month's to show time. SO.... It has been decided that for Year One we will all just show our rare machines for the "enjoymenmt and benefit of the public who does not get to see such rare pieces of American Transportation History".... And let the public vote!

Pate Cherokee Swap Meet & Concours d'Pate Bike Show continued...

In an effort to Display and Share History, The Cherokee Chapter has reached out to other vintage and classic motorycle clubs in the proper spirit of the sport, for assistance in our first year to ensure the general public that they have a stellar level and number of all brands, and all years of motorycles to view! (35 years or older of course)

The North Texas Norton Owners Group has an extremely large membership and it's club caters to all makes European. The Vintage Japanes Motorcycle Club of America (VJMC) has also committed to help our effort with bringing out high quality Asian and Japanese marques to display. Another private group is putting together a display area of vintage drag racing machines. We do not have a count yet, but before anyone asks..." I predict" that we should have somewhere around 100+ rare American manufac turered machines represented from 1900 – 1980. I am hopeful we can put together another 50+ European machines and it is still too early to guess on the Asian / Japanese Theatre. But I will tell you the enthusiasm by all clubs is very high to have a first class venue located in The Central South! I thank these clubs immensely now in advanceand am I not going to be surprised with what we end up with!

We intend have the largest display of Vintage and Classic Motorcycles ever assembled in Texas for public viewing. We hope you wish to be a part of this historic effort this coming spring. So get those last minute details done on your machines and get them ready to show!
