The Cherokee Chapter Leads by Example!

Show Me, Don't Tell Me is something my father told me from very early in my life. "Talk is talk... just walk the walk." "Don't tell me what you are going to do...Show me the Results." These early life lessons seem very appropriate to describe our Chapter in many ways at present.

Two and a half years ago we had 25-30 members and a board of directors that was pretty tired from serving for so many years. Our average member age was as it currently is in the AMCA... just too high. Normal was the same few people worked their "rears" off and no one wanted to take their turn to be on the Board of Directors. This seems to be an issue with many small AMCA Chapters over the past decades. Yet the current AMCA National BoD's still feel and preach that having more smaller, more localized Chapters is still the answer. We understand those that live in highly populated, traffic congested parts of America such at the upper Eastern Seaboard, and in other heavily populated areas such as LA, etc... But America is a big place and in more sparsely populated states and regions where people drive greater distances on a daily basis in their lives the rule is different perhaps.

Another topic of concern with Chapters is how to attract new members, get them activated and retain them for years to come by having

an enthusiasm level that is high enough, having enough local and regional events for them to attend and enjoy their classic motorcycles, their memorabilia collecting or even the simplest enjoyment of our great sport, the fellowship of meeting many new members with similar interests. New blood is a good thing. Change is a good thing when implemented in moderation and with proper planning.

Today the Cherokee Chptr. has proven that bigger can be better. Today we have over 250 active members.

That is a 1,000% increase in membership in 2.5 years.

Why does it work so well? There are a few reasons. First... all small AMCA Chapters can have issues at times with none of their membership wishing to step up and volunteer to serve as an event chairman or to be on the board of directors. This causes existing BoD members to shoulder far too much load and to get tired. By having one extremely sharp BoD's that represent all corners of the State of Texas and Oklahoma our members in every region do vote & have representation.

projects. Twice a year we hold large events that all members can travel to and the events are worth the gas and hotel money. Our Spring Cherokee / Pate Swap Meet / Concours Bike Show and our annual Fall Road Run are just two examples here.

All of this works well as there is only one BoD's, one checkbook, one newsletter and website to handle. The members can just enjoy their hobby. The side benefit is that by having such a large membership the talent pool of people for event chair positions, volunteers to work events and future BoD positions is large as well. People will take their turns to plan and run an event and to be on the board. No one wants to step up when things are stagnated, but many do when the Parade is Fun.

We have much to be proud for and we have all accomplished much together as a Chapter.

Besides the Vending and Bike Show we also held a VIP Party to recognize event sponsors & VIP participants A professional catering company fed 150 VIP and Cherokee Volunteers and an outstanding Rock and Roll Band played live music most of the evening at Shadetree Fabrications facility a few miles from Pate. Special Thanks go to our wonderful event sponsors, John Parham, The National Motorcycle Museum, Dale Walksler, Wheels Through Time Museum, Chris and Heather with Cycle Source Magazine, Chris Maida, Editor of American Iron Magazine, Carson Classic Motors, Kirk Sharp, Just Kickers, Dallas TX.; Alan Stuhlburg, Revival Cycles, Austin TX., Big Greg Hale, MC Creations, Houston TX.; Kyle Shorey, Shadetree Fabrications, and many more.

Planning and work is already well underway for the 2016 Cherokee Pate Swap Meet and Concours d'Pate Bike Show. We will have Cherokee members attending the rest of the AMCA Events this year to promote our event. Plus we will have Cherokee people at Davenport & Barbers spreading the word as well.

The VIP Party will be in a new location with a new sponsor. Plus we are getting interest of larger major manufacturers in securing larger spots to bring their larger booths in. Chapter Business...


