We just want to know about them, particularly around Houston (SE Texas) and West Texas as we would like to boost our membership in these areas of the state as we continue to grow our Chapter.


An ideal weekend route would be a 100 to a 150 mile route on a Saturday and a 25 to 75 mile ride on Sunday centered around a small town or place (such as state parks) which has hotel and/or camping. And lastly have day activities that would interest non-riders (i.e. wives & girlfriends)

These are just guidelines and are not meant to exclude other routes that might not have all these attributes or even more.

Our goal is to have 6 weekend road runs routes in our back pocket and rotate these annually, with one in the Spring and one in the Fall. If we get more routes then that is a great situation for us.

You provide the route suggestions with a rough map and/or brief description. We'll make it happen. Simple as that. This is an opportunity to make your club better.

This event is getting worldwide media coverage w/11 countries represented within a field of 114 motorcycles ranging from 1912 – 1936. Please stay tuned daily and you will get caught up in the excitement as we all ride 4,200+ miles from Daytona Beach Florida to Puget Sound Washington.

#### Cherokee Concourse de Pate Texas Motor Speedway April 30 to May 3, 2015

The Cherokee Chapter has secured from the Pate
Transportation Swap Meet a large block of spaces to be used for our Antique
Motorcycle Display, Swap Meet spaces for antique motorcycle vendors and a large RV parking area for socializing. The Pate Swap Meet is 10 times the size of Davenport and is visited by 100,000+ people yearly

The Cherokee Chapter plans to host a Peoples' Choice **Antique Motorcycle Show. Cherokee Concours de Pate** while making available vending spaces for the sale of motorcycles and related antique parts from well-known national and local vendors. The Chapter has paid for this large block of spaces, (over 200 individual vending spaces) the first time an area at Pate will be exclusively set aside for motorcycle use, and we will assign these spaces on a first come first served basis.

A large group of our members attended the Wauseon OH Swap Meet, while others attended at the Arlington Swap Meet and Bike Show . Information of The Pate Events was distributed at each event.

More of our members will be attending the Blackhawk Swap Meet and Races in Davenport making information available to vendors and enthusiasts.

When the Cannonball is concluded and we all have a bit of time to get caught up in our personal lives...Our Chapter Board has much to do to finish our 2014 year up. As Greg stated in his column, we are planning two Chapter Mini-Road Runs a year starting Spring 2015. ### Cannonball 2013 . . . by Steve Klein

The 2014 Cannonball Endurance Run, Coast to Coast is the third such event and is bigger and better than ever. It is now garnering Worldwide attention with riders from 11 countries competing in what is being billed as the Toughest Motorcycle Race in America. Countries are: America Spain Italy France Germany Holland United Kingdom South Africa Poland Canada Ireland Japan

In all 114 Riders are registered and the Kick Off Banquet is being held in Daytona Beach Florida the evening before the race start date of September 5<sup>th</sup>. As Shelby mentioned, the promoters have just announced an additional 325 tickets pre-sold for the banquet and that is in addition to the 114 rider tickets and all the tickets for the Teams of each Rider. What a send-off this will be! A Full 10 Riders in this event will be members of our own Cherokee Chapter. APPLAUSE HERE FOLKS! All are listed in the next article with the exception of these members whom were not included in the email sent below a few days ago by David Lloyd.

- ✓ Robert "Big Swede" Gustavsson Frisco TX (Just became a new member...Welcome Big Swede!
- ✓ Rowdy Schenck Carlsbad NM. (Rowdy is a friend of our very own Mike Bell) Also a new Member. Welcome!
- Mike Bell, Texas Cherokee Chapter Member is making this his second Cannonball. Mike is a very accomplished rider.
- ✓ Clyde Crouch Texas is riding his 1929 Excelsior Henderson Streamline Four cylinder. (I believe the only non-HD entrant from our Chapter?) Clyde, Mike, Rowdy, and Robert... All the Best!

This year's race covers a grueling 4,200+ miles from the Atlantic Ocean at Daytona Beach Florida to Tacoma WA Puget Sound Area at the Pacific Ocean. Many riders dip their back tire at the starting line and dip their front tire at the finish line. Some dip water into a small vial and pour it into the Pacific Ocean at the conclusion of the event. All motorcycles must be newer than 1937 so the newest models racing are (get this) 78 years old. Many machines are approaching 100 years old. David Lloyd's #54 machine is a 1919 HD twin and I believe his machine is only the 6<sup>th</sup> oldest. A true test of man and machine to find, rebuild, tune and keep these venerable old mounts of the past with tired steel and alloy, reliable enough to ride approximately 300 miles per day for three weeks straight in every conceivable road and weather conditions. Plus for riders from our region they get to travel Coast to Coast twice. Drive to Daytona Beach. Ride the Cannonball diagonally cross country to Washing State. Then drive half way across America to get back home. That is commitment!

**Our Members Support our Riders.** Three weeks ago I challenged our entire membership to pledge individual support for this group of riders. Within 2 weeks I received **over \$8,000** from our members. Checks for \$25, \$50, \$100, \$250 or more flooded in. How often can one say they are a sponsor of such an event. I am Proud of all Members whom pledged and wrote checks. I will list all of you in the next issue as a tribute to you for your support of our sport. **Please follow The Cannonball Run as shown in the next article. You will enjoy it!** 



Welcome to a Journey across America – This update of 2014 Cannonball Motorcycle endurance run is written from the perspective of Team Carson Classic Motors. Our team of 8 riders and 8 crew members will leave Daytona Beach FL on September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2014 (16 days) and travel 17 days to reach Tacoma, WA on September 21, 2014. Nearly 100 people have signed in to receive these updates. Leave me begin by thanking each one of you personally, for your help, time, resources, prayers, and encouragement. I am so honored to have the opportunity to participate in this epic event!

Let me start with some introductions to the actual Team riders and Crew: Team Carson Classic Motors, from Livingston, Texas, known as CCM, will host 8 riders in the event. Carson Classic Motors is pleased to announce their participation in the "Hardest Motorcycle Race in the World," the Motorcycle Cannonball Endurance Run. During the 17 day, 4,200 mile race from Florida to Washington, eight riders will represent the Carson Classic Motors team against a field of close to 106 other competitors from 11 countries on pre-1937 motorcycles. Yes... the newest motorcycles competing will be 78 years old and some of the oldest are 100 years old.

Wauseon OH Swap Meet, Bike Show and Vintage Races

For the past dozen or so years I keep hearing about the Wauseon Meet in Northern OH. It's like taking a Family Vacation and Grand Swap Meet / Bike Show / Vintage Races all in one! This year Joan and I had The Rig backed in the driveway, the living quarters supplied for a week or more, two bikes tied down, her tiny Fiat strapped in the rear ready for our annual trip to Maggie Valley to see our good friends Dale and Matt Walksler at Wheels Through Time Museum and to spend some glorious days riding the Blue Ridge Parkway and The Cherahola Skyway. Note from Joan: FIAT stands for Fits In A Trailer" Then we get an invitation from Fred and Nancy Davis to come up and enjoy Wauseon this year. Fred and Nancy were this year's Co-Chair (Wo)Man (did I do that right?) Fred is also the AMCA National Director of Chapters and he reminded me that I did have a Chapter Presidents Meeting during this event. REALLY... Drive 1,270 miles to go to a one hour meeting. Guilt did ensue however and we took a short 1,270 mile left hand turn and drove almost to Detroit for crying out loud. That can be converted to 13, 300+ miles of cornfields for you Southern Folk.

And beautiful cornfields they were. Ohio is full of picturesque small farm towns where every road ditch, farm yard and fence line is mowed. All building are painted and everything is maintained. I had almost forgotten how much pride people in the Midwest take in maintaining their properties along every single blacktop and gravel road. Plus every field was green, the corn was tall, there were bales of straw in the fields and it was a nice respite from the 8 year long drought we have experienced here in Central TX. God does still know how to make it rain...Just not at our house?

We arrived a day early as The Klein's always wish to do at any event. Being 70 feet long we just do not show up late and expect to get a parking spot! On the way through small Wauseon downtown I watched a sun tanned, windblown rider on an FXR follow me from stoplight to stoplight. Remember in old westerns when a group of old cowboys around a chuck wagon would see a rider on the horizon and exclaim "That's Ole Jesse riding up there" They always could tell a rider by his riding style. When I stopped the semi at the next light...I stepped out on the fuel tank and yelled back at my old friend Neal Cockrum. I knew right away at his riding style exactly who it was. I had not seen Neal in many years. We waved him by and he led us to the local fair grounds.

We parked behind a large group of 60 ft. tall trees and set up camp, unloaded the garage in the trailer and tossed the lawn chairs out front. Within minutes Houston Texas Cherokee Members Larenda and Henry Nicar walked up and said Howdy. Shortly after that Fred Davis arrived in his golf cart. Elton and Debbie Dillon Morris, Greg Nelson, Dave and JoAnn Kugle were also depleted of gas dollars to attend this event. Plus Joe Burch who has been on vacation for something like 3 years (actually 6 month's) rode his venerable 65 Panhead down from somewhere in Michigan to see us all. Over the next two days Joan and I enjoyed this Event more than any I can remember in years. The fairgrounds is simply wonderful with dozens of one lane blacktop streets all tree lined and over 900 vending spaces were all filled on both sides of every street. There were so many vendors this year that they started setting up rows of booths outside the fairgrounds. If a part was not at this swap meet...It does not exist.

The Vintage Races were a spectacle also. What a great old facility. The weather was cool, the atmosphere was that of an old fashioned county fair when we were kids. Men walked up and down the stands hawking sodas and hot dogs. Kids played in grassy areas and I never once saw anything out of order or out of hand. The Motor Maids did a ceremony flag lap around the track to a standing ovation. Some of the greatest ladies in America folks! Applause goes to Matt Walksler for winning the Board track Race. 
